Vision Statement:

Background: I am an international health economist, university leader and institution builder with a record of innovative, cross-sectoral initiatives, and ground-breaking research agendas focused on transforming policy. My areas of research include poverty and inequity, educational policy, health policy and system reform, economic policy, and women and children.

In my professional life, I have had the opportunity to work across sectors, and catalyze high-impact initiatives working across diverse roles as policymaker, faculty member, researcher, university administrator, national and international civil society leader, author, patient advocate, and partner of a high-level leader in government and higher education. This unique set of experiences has allowed me to develop and project my skills and apply them in various ways: to contribute to solving multiple, pressing health and equity challenges; with people of different cultures; working as a Canadian in foreign governments at the highest levels of national and global policy making; with university presidents and rectors from across the Americas; and, with volunteers at all levels spanning First Spouses, grassroots activists and service providers, and survivors of life-threatening illness and trauma.

Vision and Goals: I dedicate myself, personally and professionally, to making our world safer, healthier, more prosperous, and more equitable for all. Over my nearly 40-year career, through rigorous scholarship and evidence-based advocacy, institution-building and policy work in the social sectors I have made inroads towards those goals. I am both grateful for the opportunities I have had and proud of what I have accomplished.

BIO SKETCH: Felicia Marie Knaul BA (International Development, University of Toronto), MA, PhD (Economics, Harvard University) is internationally recognized for her transformative and translational research in global health, health systems, health economics, and for her work's focus on reducing inequities. Her work has influenced policy and improved the condition of at-risk populations in low and middle-income countries, particularly in Latin America. She founded a Mexican civil society organization; spearheaded multiple global networks of researchers, higher education leaders, advocacy organizations, policymakers, and multi-sectoral policy initiatives. She has authored over 350 academic and policy publications (SCOPUS: h-index: 44; 11,550 citations), delivered hundreds of invited lectures, and designed and organized nearly 75 international research symposia.

At the University of California Los Angeles (UCLA) she is Associate of the Chancellor, Distinguished Professor of Medicine at the David Geffen School of Medicine; Senior Advisor to the Dean and to the President of UCLA Health; Director of Global Health and Member to the Cancer Control and Survivorship Research Program, Jonsson Comprehensive Cancer Center. Before coming to UCLA, at the University of Miami, she served as Director of the Institute for Advanced Study of the Americas and Director of the Office of Hemispheric and Global Affairs. She was also a Professor at the Leonard M. Miller School of Medicine, with cross-appointments at the School of Nursing and Health Studies, the Miami Herbert Business School and the College of Arts and Sciences, and was a Full Member of the Sylvester Comprehensive Cancer Center. Prior to her time at the University of Miami, she served as the Director of the Harvard Global Equity Initiative and was an Associate Professor at the Harvard Medical School.

In Mexico, she maintains an active research presence, leading a research team focusing on health equity and collaborating with the Mexican Health Foundation, and was Honorary Research Professor of Medical Sciences at the National Institute of Public Health. As of November 2024, she is Distinguished Visiting Professor in Public Health at the School of Medicine and Health Sciences, and Member of the Faculty of Excellence initiative at TEC de Monterrey.

She previously served in high-ranking posts in the Secretariat of Public Education and in the Secretariat of Social Development of Mexico and worked on the teams that designed and implemented the 2003 Mexican health reform (*Seguro Popular*) and the 1993 Colombian health reform. While serving in Mexico's Ministry of Education, Dr. Knaul designed and implemented *Sigamos Aprendiendo en el Hospital* (Let's Keep Learning in the Hospital), a groundbreaking national program that established officially recognized schools within tertiary hospitals across the country.

A woman who has lived through breast cancer, Dr. Knaul founded and serves as President of *Cáncer de Mama: Tómatelo a Pecho*, a Mexican non-profit agency originally focused on breast cancer which has now expanded its mandate to include women's health and health system strengthening. Since its founding in 2008, *Tómatelo a Pecho* has trained thousands of primary care personnel using novel techniques.

She lectures globally on the challenge of cancer, both as a patient advocate and health systems researcher. She chronicled her own cancer journey and those of other women in two published books: *Tómatelo a Pecho* (Grupo Santillana, 2009) and *Beauty without the Breast* (Harvard University Press, 2013).

Dr. Knaul's wide-ranging research has focused on violence against women and children, access to pain relief and palliative care, cancer (particularly breast cancer), health systems and reform, health financing, women and health, poverty and inequity, female labor force participation, and at-risk children and youth. She led and edited several books including *Closing the Cancer Divide* (Harvard U. Press).

She has established and led multiple global research networks. Dr. Knaul currently serves as the Co-Chair of *The Lancet* Commission on Violence against Women and Children and *The Lancet* Commission on Cancer and Health Systems and as Commissioner on *The Lancet* Oncology

Commission on Cancer in the Commonwealth and The Lancet Respiratory Medicine Commission on Palliative Care Integration in Serious Respiratory Illness.

From 2014 to 2017, she founded and co-chaired (with Dr. Paul Farmer) *The Lancet* Commission on Global Access to Palliative Care and Pain Relief and lead-authored its report, described as “landmark” by *The Lancet*, with 61 global experts. Her work was featured in major outlets such as the BBC and the Washington Post. From 2012 to 2015, Dr. Knaul contributed to *The Lancet* Commission on Women and Health as a leading co-author, and more recently served on *The Lancet* Commissions on the Value of Death (2022) and Breast Cancer (2024). Dr. Knaul has also led a series of health policy papers in *The Lancet* spanning two decades of health reform in Mexico, most recently in 2023 covering the response to the COVID-19 pandemic, and originating from *The Lancet*’s 2006 Mexico series, which she chaired. Dr. Knaul also played a leadership role in establishing the *Covid-19 Latam Observatory*, which brought together a group of researchers from eight Latin American countries to collect and analyze data on COVID-19 and sub-national policymaking.

Dr. Knaul is an elected member of the Mexican National Academy of Medicine, inducted Fellow of the Canadian Academy of Health Sciences, Honorary Fellow of the American Academy of Nursing and was awarded Senior Level III of the Mexican National System of Researchers in 2018. She sits on several volunteer boards, including Kristi House, Esperanza United and the International Association for Hospice and Palliative Care.

Knaul is a citizen of Canada and the UK and holds residency in the USA and Mexico. She and her husband, Dr. Julio Frenk, have two children, Sofia Hannah and Mariana Havivah.

Extended Personal Statement and Summary of Accomplishments:

Felicia Marie Knaul, BA (International Development, University of Toronto), MA, PhD (Economics, Harvard University), has dedicated more than three decades of her career to translational research, advocacy and policy work in global health, social development and higher education, focused on reducing inequities and improving the condition of vulnerable groups, primarily in low and middle-income countries, particularly in Latin America and the Caribbean.

At the University of California Los Angeles (UCLA) she is Associate of the Chancellor, Distinguished Professor of Medicine at the David Geffen School of Medicine; Senior Advisor to the Dean and to the President of UCLA Health; Director of Global Health and Member to the Cancer Control and Survivorship Research Program, Jonsson Comprehensive Cancer Center. Before coming to UCLA, at the University of Miami, she served as Director of the Institute for Advanced Study of the Americas and director of the Office of Hemispheric and Global Affairs. She held academic appointment as Full Professor at the Leonard M. Miller School of Medicine, and was cross-appointed at the School of Nursing and Health Studies, the Miami Herbert Business School, and the College of Arts and Sciences. Dr Knaul was also a Full Member of the Cancer Control Program at the Sylvester Comprehensive Cancer Center. From 2009 to 2015, she was Associate Professor at Harvard Medical School and Director of the Harvard Global Equity Initiative, an inter-faculty program chaired by Nobel Laureate Amartya Sen.

She maintains a strong advocacy and research base in Mexico. She holds the position of Senior Economist at the Mexican Health Foundation (FUNSALUD), Distinguished Visiting Professor in Public Health at the School of Medicine and Health Sciences, and holds a Member of the Faculty of Excellence initiative role in one of Mexico’s leading universities, the Tecnológico de Monterrey; she was also Honorary Research Professor of Medical Sciences at the National Institute of Public Health of Mexico. In 2008, as a result of her breast cancer experience, Dr. Knaul founded Cáncer de Mama: Tómatelo a Pecho, a Mexican non-profit agency that has promoted research,

advocacy, awareness, and early detection of breast cancer since its inception. She lectures globally on the challenge of cancer, both as a patient advocate and as a health systems researcher. She also published the memoir *Tómatelo a Pecho* (Grupo Santillana, 2009) and *Beauty without the Breast* (Harvard University Press/ Harvard Global Equity Initiative 2013). Her story and her work have been featured in *Science*, *Cancer Today*, *Miami ABC 10*, the *Miami Herald*, *The Lancet*, *WHO Bulletin*, and *Newsweek en Español*. In 2019, *Tómatelo a Pecho* expanded its mandate to promote women's health broadly, including research focused on ending gender-based violence.

She has held senior federal government positions at the Ministries of Education and Social Development of Mexico, and the Colombian Department of Planning and worked on health reform and social development in both countries. She has led and participated in several global policy reports, including the World Health Report 2000, and directed the production of various papers for the government of Mexico on education, health and children's rights. While working for the Minister of Education of Mexico she designed and implemented an evidence-based national, inter-institutional program *Sigamos Aprendiendo en el Hospital* (*Let's Keep Learning in the Hospital*), which catalyzed the placement of officially recognized schools in tertiary hospitals throughout the country. As the founder and director of the program, she organized an inter-institutional, multi-disciplinary group of researchers, government leaders, advocates and donors. To achieve its goals, this group collaborated with the First Lady and the ministers of health and education. This work produced research publications documenting both the design and the initial results of the program. She also chaired a multi-sectorial, inter-institutional working group and lead authored the *Programa Nacional de Acción en favor de la Infancia 2002-2010* (the National Action Program for Children), the blueprint for the Mexican response to the Special 2012 Session of the United Nations. Working in a voluntary capacity with the Ministry of Health from 2000 to 2006, she led much of the analysis on financing and health spending that translated into the design of the *Seguro Popular*.

Her research focuses on global health, violence against women and children, gender-based violence, cancer (particularly breast cancer), access to pain relief and palliative care, health systems and reform, health financing, women and health, medical employment, poverty and inequity, female labor force participation, and at-risk children and youth.

Dr. Knaul has produced over 350 academic and policy publications (h-index: 44; over 11,550 citations). Most notable among them is *The Lancet* Commission report: "Alleviating the access abyss in palliative care and pain relief – an imperative of universal health coverage," for which she was a lead author. Dubbed a "landmark report" by *The Lancet*, the research was featured in the BBC, the Washington Post, Project Syndicate, The Guardian, and Voice of America and has spawned an array of research papers, new data collection initiatives, and advocacy and policy work. It was even officially adopted by the International Narcotics Control Board to assess country need and performance. From 2012-2015, she was a member of *The Lancet* Commission on Women and Health and a leading co-author of its June 2015 report. The findings she contributed have been incorporated into global policymaking by the World Health Organization. This Commission has also spawned a stream of research initiatives and she leads an international group of scholars preparing follow-up submissions refining the estimates of gender differentials in paid and unpaid contributions to health and caregiving and on gender and caregiving. This includes an invited submission to *Nature Medicine* for the Series on women's health throughout the life course. She also served on *The Lancet* Commission on the Value of Death, published in 2022, *The Lancet* Commission on Breast Cancer, published in April 2024, and *The Lancet* Commission on Investing in Health 3.0, published in October 2024.

She has authored and served as lead editor of several books and special issues of journals, including *Closing the Cancer Divide* (Harvard University Press/Harvard Global Equity Initiative 2012), *Financing Health in Latin America: Household Spending and Impoverishment* (Harvard University Press/Harvard Global Equity Initiative 2013), *Caleidoscopio de la Salud. De la Investigación a las Políticas y de las Políticas a la Acción, Inclusión educativa para niños, niñas y jóvenes hospitalizados* (Fondo de Cultura Económica e Intersistemas 2006), and *Salud Pública de*

México, Edición Especial sobre Cáncer de Mama: un reto para la sociedad y los sistemas de salud 2009.

In 2023 she was the lead author on the third in a series of health policy papers in *The Lancet* on Mexico's health system covering both the dismantling of the 2003 health reform (*Seguro Popular*) and the response to the COVID-19 pandemic. This paper follows on the 2012 review of *Seguro Popular* and *The Lancet's* 2006 Mexico series, which she also chaired. Her work on *Seguro Popular* and financial protection in Mexico won the 2005 Global Development Network Prize for Outstanding Research on Change in the Health Sector.

Dr. Knaul maintains a strong and synergistic global program of research and translation of research into policy making and contributes to an array of research networks and organizations that promote and disseminate evidence. She currently Co-Chairs *The Lancet* Commission on Cancer and Health Systems and *The Lancet* Commission on Violence against Women and Children. From 2014-2017, she founded and co-chaired (with Dr. Paul Farmer) *The Lancet* Commission on Global Access to Palliative Care and Pain Relief. Initiated in 2021, this work has now spawned a highly productive global research hub under her leadership. In 2020 and 2021 she brought together and led a group of researchers from eight Latin American countries to collect and analyze data on COVID-19 and sub-national policy making. This resulted in multiple group-science papers and new health systems research. She founded and directed the Harvard Global Task Force on Expanded Access to Cancer Care and Control and was a member of the Global Task Force on Radiotherapy for Cancer Control. Dr. Knaul also coordinated the Global Network for Health Equity, an initiative that brought together researchers from Latin America, in association with the Asia EQUITAP network and the Africa SHIELD network with funding from IDRC Canada.

She serves as Commissioner on *The Lancet* Oncology Commission on Cancer in the Commonwealth and The Lancet Respiratory Medicine Commission on Palliative Care Integration in Serious Respiratory Illness, as well as on the international advisory board of *The Lancet Global Health* and *The Lancet Regional Health – Americas*. She also sits on the boards of several not-for-profits dedicated to undertaking and disseminating global health research, including Kristi House, Esperanza United, and the International Association for Hospice & Palliative Care. She also previously served on the board of the Union for International Cancer Control (2010-2014). She has worked with bilateral and multilateral agencies such as the World Health Organization and the World Bank and has participated in several global policy reports.

Based on her research accomplishments, Dr. Knaul was made a member of the Mexican National Academy of Medicine. She was also inducted into the Canadian Academy of Health Sciences in 2020 and made an Honorary Fellow of the American Academy of Nursing in 2021. In 2018, she was awarded Senior Level III of the Mexican National System of Researchers.

She has received several recognitions for her work and most recently, in 2024, was inducted into the International Women's Forum. She was named "Local Hero" by the American Medical Women's Association in 2016, and one of Mexico's most influential women in 2013. She was awarded "Flama, Vida y Mujer" by the Autonomous University of the State of Nuevo Leon, and the Global Health Catalyst Award by students at Harvard University. She also received the Philanthropy Award from Fairchild Tropical Botanic Garden and has been featured in the Boca Raton Observer, Indulge Magazine, and Ocean Drive.

Dr. Knaul is a citizen of Canada and the United Kingdom, and a permanent resident of Mexico. She and her husband, Dr. Julio Frenk, have two children, Sofia Hannah (29) and Mariana Havivah (21). Her brother, Jonathan Knaul, is a retired Major of the Canadian Armed Forces with multiple tours of duty and is now a test pilot based in Los Angeles, California. Her other activities include equestrianism, yoga, swimming and walks with her dogs Petunia and Shimmy.
